



PRESCRIPTION *for* TEACHERS

YOUR CLASSROOM PARTICIPATION CAN HELP CURE HOMELESSNESS IN MARIN!

Host

Invite a speaker to your classroom for a discussion on ending homelessness in our community.

Film

Students are innovative video producers. A class project might include making a short film on family homelessness or affordable housing.

Organize

Donation drives make a difference! Organize a school-wide drive for socks, towels, coats, sleeping bags, food and other items.

Research

Assign a report or web-based research project on homelessness in Marin.

Bake

Have a bake sale or set up a lemonade stand to raise funds and awareness.

Visit

Take students on a field trip to one (or more) of the organizations in the community that assists people who are homeless.

Volunteer

Students can learn by lending a hand. Volunteers can serve meals; paint a room; plant a garden; or read a story at one of the organizations serving homeless families.

Report

Students can interview someone who is homeless or someone who works with people experiencing homelessness and write their story for your school newspaper.

Show

Play a short movie for your classroom or assembly. Several local organizations have films available for loan; organization staff can also accompany the movie to give a presentation or answer questions.

Hold a Teach-in

Dedicate a day on learning about homelessness in all classrooms and in all subject areas.
